



Improving living conditions

Just as planting requires preparing the land, planting the right seeds and caring for them until harvest, community development requires adequate preparation of the environment, planting local resources and continuous care of the projects until they bear fruit.

The satisfaction of basic needs can be compared to harvesting, where effort and planning result in the production of desired products. Similarly, when communities manage to satisfy their basic needs, they experience a harvest of well-being and prosperity.

The seed of change germinates in the implementation of productive projects and ventures, which, like plants, require constant care and attention to reach their full potential.

Just as in agriculture the cultivation of local varieties adapted to the environment is promoted, in community development the use of local resources and the appreciation of ancestral traditions and knowledge. These resources, such as native seeds, are the basis for long-term sustainability, as they are rooted in the land and culture of the community.

The roots of our projects are nourished by the commitment and active participation of the community, as well as the effective leadership of those who guide the process.

At Fondo para la Paz, we understand that to achieve meaningful results, we must first sow the seeds of change.

During 2023, we immersed ourselves in the fertile ground of collaboration and solidarity, sowing opportunities and cultivating strategic alliances that have strengthened our commitment to the indigenous communities with which we work.





By the end of 2023, a total amount of **\$13,009,971.00** was raised in untagged donations, which represented a 3% growth compared to the previous fiscal year.







Community mobilization: In-kind mobilization from institutional allied communities


Expenditures by destination of the resource

Expenditures by nature of resources


It refers to the areas in which the Institution's resources were applied.



We firmly believe in reaping the rewards of a work environment where every seed of dedication and effort is carefully nurtured.

It is with this approach that we see not only individual success flourish, but also collective success, because we know that when we sow trust, respect and opportunities, we reap committed and happy teams.

We have organized workshops with the aim of providing basic tools to know how to act or not act in situations of violence, risk or psychological alarm.

These sessions focused on strengthening social-emotional skills for our internal team, providing a safe and learning space where participants were able to acquire key competencies to face and manage difficult situations with greater effectiveness and resilience.

It cost fear, it cost dedication, it cost patience... Coximalco, one of the communities of Mixtla de Altamirano where you couldn't call meetings with women because some people took up arms.

However, the community intervention was carried out in a peaceful manner.
